

Overview of Peer-to-Peer Roundtables

The NPA Annual Conference Peer-to-Peer Roundtables have a new format this year. Previously, NPA offered facilitated roundtables as a dedicated track that resembled traditional breakout sessions but focused more on discussion than presentation. The sessions took place in individual breakout rooms and often included a PowerPoint presentation.

The redesigned Peer-to-Peer Roundtables will spotlight emerging hot topics in PACE in a shared setting that encourages networking and meaningful discussion among peers. To support authentic peer engagement and provide the best possible experience, vendors and consultants will not present during these sessions. Attendance is limited to staff members of PACE organizations only.

FAQs

What should I expect?

All attendees will gather in a designated room containing 10 to 30 discussion tables. Each table will accommodate approximately eight to 10 attendees and will be assigned one of the topics listed on the agenda.

A facilitator will be assigned to each table to introduce the topic, provide a brief overview, review the discussion objectives, and guide participant dialogue. Attendees will be encouraged to share experiences, exchange ideas, discuss challenges, and explore practical solutions related to the topic.

When will the roundtables take place?

The roundtables will be held on Tuesday, Oct. 13, at 2-2:45 p.m. and 4-4:45 p.m.

Can I attend more than one roundtable?

Attendees may participate in one roundtable during each session. Some topics offered during the first session may be repeated during the second session to allow additional attendees the opportunity to participate.

How do I reserve a seat?

There is no advance registration. Seats are first come, first served, so we encourage you to arrive early to get a seat at your preferred table.

Can I access handouts?

The Peer-to-Peer Roundtables will not include PowerPoint presentations. Facilitators may choose to provide handouts at the table, but they will not be available in the conference app. Before the end of the session, facilitators will provide their contact information at the table.
